...SAW **JOY DIVISION** PLAY A NUMBER OF TIMES, AND WITNESSED THEIR LAST EVER GIG, THIRTY YEARS AGO. HE TELLS THE STORY OF JOY DIVISION, THEIR SINGER IAN CURTIS, THEIR CITY, AND THEIR MUSIC.

Manchester was a post-industrial ruin when Joy Division were formed in the late 1970s. Their music made a powerful impression and appeared to reflect the darkness and devastation around them, but the singer's suicide - just days before their first American tour - ended their career.

Out of the ashes of the band, New Order were formed, and Joy Division's music has since influenced a host of other acts - from U2 and Moby, to the Killers and Arcade Fire - and inspired a number of films, including the award-winning 'Control'.
